

The event was well attended by over 50 people, comprising current and former judges, members of the Bar, solicitors and a number of his Honour's former associates, all of whom were gathered to celebrate a long and distinguished legal career.

As befitting the 'most senior puisne judge' (another of his Honour's favourite epithets), the formalities ended with a rousing chorus of 'Jolly good fellow', followed by more good wine and conversation. All in all, a fitting tribute to his Honour's dedicated service.
